REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Registration begins Monday, April 25 for Seniors (90+ credits), and Tuesday, April 26 for all other ADEP students.

You MUST clear any financial 'Hold' prior to registration.

For the most current registration information, utilize WebAdvisor. The information in the printed schedule may have changed since publication.

ADMISSION

All persons planning to enroll in ADEP courses must be admitted to the University in either regular or special student status. Prior to registration, individuals must meet with an ADEP counselor for an advisement interview and submit application materials by one week before the start of the semester. Packets containing all necessary information and forms are available in the ADEP Office.

Under certain conditions, a student may be provisionally admitted and may register for classes before completing the entire admission process. However, applicants must meet with a counselor and file an Application for Admission BEFORE REGISTRATION MAY BE ACCEPTED.

ADDING/DROPPING CLASSES

Students who wish to add or drop a class after registering must complete a Course Add/Drop form which is available online and in the ADEP Office or they may add/drop on WebAdvisor the first week of class. Classes may be added or dropped through the second week of instruction. To add a course after the second week, a petition and a \$50 late fee are required. Students may withdraw from classes (although significant financial cost is involved) up to and including the sixth week of instruction. Important add/drop dates are listed on the Academic Calendar in this bulletin.

Please Note: Students who drop for other than a medical reason after the official withdrawal date will receive a grade of "UW" (Unofficial Withdrawal) which is calculated as an 'F' in their grade point average.

COURSE LOAD

A normal course load in ADEP is 1-2 classes per term (3-8 units). A student taking 6 units in a term is considered a full-time student for financial aid purposes. Students who wish to enroll in 10 or more units in a single term must complete an Overload Request form available in the ADEP Office and online and must receive approval from the Director of the program prior to registration. All students requesting permission for an overload must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

FIRST CLASS ASSIGNMENT

Due to the accelerated format of the Adult Degree Evening Program, students are responsible for course preparation prior to the first class. Most ADEP class assignments are identified on a course syllabus which can be obtained online. By the first class meeting, students are expected to:

1. Read the syllabus.
2. Purchase necessary textbook(s).
3. Complete the first assignment for each course in which they are enrolled.

All students entering California Lutheran University are required to take the Math Placement/Proficiency Exam (MPE) before enrolling in a math course. The general education requirement in mathematics can be met by any course beyond intermediate algebra.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

CLU does not automatically cancel a student's registration if they register but do not attend class.

Students are financially responsible for the tuition charges associated with any registration in effect after the first week of the term, including those students on employer reimbursement plans.

Sponsoring companies generally will not reimburse for courses which are not satisfactorily completed. To officially withdraw from a class, students must drop the course online through WebAdvisor or submit a drop form to the ADEP Office. The date of withdrawal will determine whether tuition may be adjusted.

ADEP WITHDRAWAL CHARGES SCHEDULE

- Withdrawal from class during the first and second week of class - *no charge*.
- Withdrawal from class after the second week of class - *full charge*.

The withdrawal charge is based on one class per week and may vary for classes that meet on Saturday or on a staggered schedule. Fees are non-refundable. A variation of this policy may occur if the student has financial aid. Please note that withdrawal dates used by the Student Accounts Office for financial responsibility are not the same as withdrawal dates used by the Registrar's Office as the "last date to withdraw from a class without academic penalty."

All financial obligations must be met before academic records (diplomas and transcripts) can be released. Registration for an upcoming term will not be accepted until financial obligations are met from the previous term. For information regarding student accounts or billing procedures, please contact the Student Accounts office at (805) 493-3173.

THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, (FERPA, also known as the Buckley Amendment) is a federal law which allows students the right to inspect their education records and provides that colleges and universities will maintain the confidentiality of those records. The law basically says that no one outside the institution shall have access to your education records nor will the institution disclose other than Directory Information from those records without your written consent, except in an emergency. A copy of the full text of the law is available at the Registrar's office.

PAYMENTS

Tuition is due and payable on or before the first class meeting unless you have made alternative payment arrangements. If a balance remains at the end of any monthly billing cycle, a finance charge of 1.25% per month will be added to the account.

Students with delinquent accounts cannot register for the new term until fees from the prior term have been paid.

As a result of California legislation, CLU no longer accepts credit card payments for tuition. CLU offers monthly payment plans and we are able to accept cash, checks or ACH payments for tuition. The University will still accept credit card payments for non-tuition based costs such as parking tickets, transcripts, events, and corporate reimbursement, etc. If you have any questions regarding how to make payments on your student account, please contact the Student Accounts office at (805) 493-3180 or 3173.

ADEP CLASSIFICATION

Summer 2011

Full-Time = 6 or more units
Part-Time = 5 units or less

ADEP students must be at least half-time (3 units) to be eligible for financial aid.

Fall 2011

Full-Time = 8 or more units
Part-Time = 7 units or less

Must be registered at least half-time (4 credits) to be eligible for financial aid.

FINANCIAL AID

Some financial aid is available to ADEP students including ADEP assistantships. Eligibility for specific aid is often contingent upon full-time status and income level. Student with full-time status (6 or more units per term) and students with half-time status (3-5 units per term) are eligible for loans. Students registered for less than three units with financial need may be considered for other types of aid on a

case by case basis. Please note that proceeds from a government loan will be unavailable until after the third week of classes.

Students must be fully admitted to regular ADEP student standing prior to the start of the semester to be eligible for financial aid. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the ADEP Application for Financial Aid must be filed before a student will be reviewed for financial aid. EMPLOYER TUITION REIMBURSEMENT

Students who receive tuition reimbursement from their employer may delay payment for up to eight weeks after the last day of the term. To take advantage of this deferred payment plan, please read the following:

- Submit a confirmation letter or company plan from your employer
- Submit a completed Employer Reimbursement application prior to the term you begin your enrollment and annually thereafter each fall term
- Tuition statements are available only electronically through TouchNet
- If the application and/or company plan are received in the Student Accounts Office after the second week of the term, a \$50 late transaction fee will be assessed
- If your employer does not provide 100% reimbursement, you are responsible for paying the difference prior to the first class meeting
- If your employer reimbursement plan has a maximum annual limit, CLU will cancel your deferral when that limit is reached. You will be responsible for payment of all tuition charges exceeding your policy limit prior to the first class meeting

The print version of the application may be downloaded and faxed to (805) 493-3886 or completed online and transmitted electronically to the Student Accounts Office.

Students are ultimately responsible for payment of their fees, tuition and costs. Payment of your account is expected when your employer reimburses you or no later than eight weeks after the end of the term.

If full payment has not been received within eight weeks from the end of the term, interest of 1.25% will accrue monthly on the entire unpaid balance (including charges for a current term.) A student is ineligible to defer tuition if there is a past due balance. A hold will be placed on the account to prevent future registrations until that balance has been paid in full.
