Cal Lutheran

California Lutheran University is a private, comprehensive university affiliated with the ELCA. Ranked by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the top 20 western regional universities, CLU offers both undergraduate and graduate degrees. It is a diverse scholarly community dedicated to excellence in the liberal arts and professional studies. Rooted in the Lutheran tradition of Christian faith, the University encourages critical inquiry into matters of both faith and reason. The mission of the University is to educate leaders for a global society who are strong in character and judgment, confident in their identity and vocation, and committed to service and justice.

LOCATION Located midway between Los Angeles and Santa Barbara, Thousand Oaks is nine miles inland from the Pacific Ocean and is easily accessible from the 101 Freeway. Thousand Oaks is rated the second safest city of its size in America according to FBI statistics.

FACULTY 93% percent of our full-time faculty hold doctorate or terminal degrees. Student-to-faculty ratio is 15:1. Average class size is 22.

ACADEMICS 36 majors and 28 minors. Pre-professional preparation in dental, engineering, law, medicine, physical therapy, seminary, and veterinary.

STUDENT BODY 1,920 full-time undergraduates represent 30 states and 30 foreign countries. 1,100 students reside on campus in 13 co-ed residence halls. Religious affiliation includes 48% Protestant (26% Lutheran and 22% other denominations); 21% Roman Catholic; 4% other; 27% declined to state.

ATHLETICS CLU is a member of the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) and the NCAA Division III. Men's teams compete in baseball, basketball, cross country, diving, football, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, track and field, and water polo. Women's teams compete in basketball, cross country, diving, softball, soccer, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and water polo. Over the last decade, CLU teams have won 44 SCIAC championships.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE Need-based and non-need-based college scholarships, low-interest, long-term loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, Cal Grants, Federal Pell Grants and Federal Work Study. Eighty percent of all CLU students receive some form of financial assistance.

ADMISSION Deadline to apply Early Action is November 15. Regular admission priority deadline is March 1.

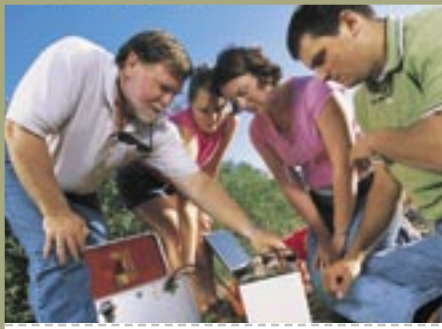
