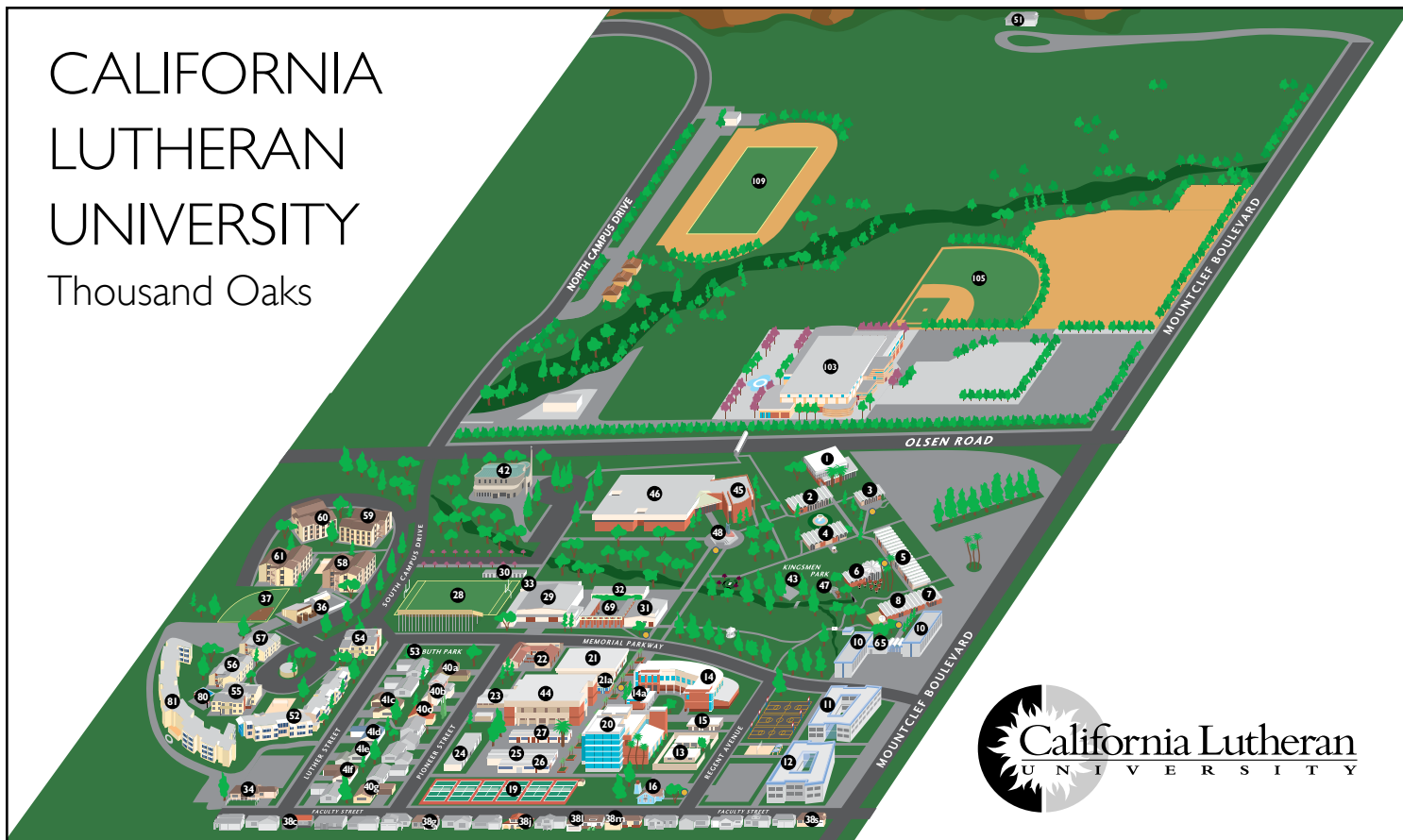
## GRADUATE PROGRAM FACT SHEET FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

<b>ADMISSION</b>	Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution with a minimum grade point average of 3.0 or equivalent course work that has been evaluated for equivalency to a U.S. bachelor's degree by an equivalency evaluation agency and course grades which show above average academic ability.

<b>CALENDARS</b>	<p><i>Master of Business Administration, Master of Public Policy and Administration, and Master of Computer Science:</i> Year round calendar with four 11-week terms, fall, winter, spring and summer</p> <p><i>Education:</i> Two 15-week semesters, fall and spring, and several summer sessions</p> <p><i>Psychology:</i> Two 15-week semesters, fall and spring, and two 6-week summer terms</p>																		
<b>CLASS TIMES</b>	Most classes are scheduled once a week in the late afternoon and evening hours to accommodate adult learners who maybe employed full time and pursuing course work on a part-time basis.																		
<b>LOCATIONS</b>	Graduate classes are held on the main campus in Thousand Oaks and at off-campus graduate centers in Oxnard and Woodland Hills. Not every program is offered at each location.																		
<b>STUDENT PROFILE</b>	Each semester, Cal Lutheran enrolls over 1,000 in its graduate and adult programs. There are over 80 international students at CLU from from all over the globe including India, Japan, Sweden, Germany, Austria, France, Taiwan, China, South Korea, and Norway. These students come to Cal Lutheran for their advanced degree seeking professional advantage and career advancement in all fields, but especially in Business, Computer Science, Psychology, and Education.
